AN ORDINANCE ADDING A NEW SECTION TO THE GUTHRIE MUNICIPAL CODE ESTABLISHING A TRAP-NEUTER-RETURN (TNR) PROGRAM FOR COMMUNITY CATS; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS, PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS, GUIDELINES FOR CAREGIVERS, AND PROTECTIONS FOR EAR-TIPPED CATS; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

SECTION 1. PURPOSE

The City of Guthrie recognizes that Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) is the most humane and effective method for managing and reducing the community cat population. This ordinance provides a legal framework for TNR and protects the rights of caregivers and ear-tipped cats.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS

Community Cat – A free-roaming cat, with no identifiable owner, that may be feral or socialized and is cared for by one or more residents.

TNR Program – A process where community cats are humanely trapped, sterilized, vaccinated against rabies, ear-tipped, and returned to their original outdoor location.

Ear-Tip – The removal of the distal one-quarter of a cat's left ear while the cat is under anesthesia, indicating sterilization and rabies vaccination.

Caregiver – Any individual or organization, including a TNR program, that provides food, shelter, or medical care to community cats and seeks to manage them through TNR.

SECTION 3. COMMUNITY CAT PROGRAM AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Legal Activity

 Participation in a TNR program, including the trapping, sterilization, vaccination, eartipping, and return of community cats, is legal and encouraged within the City of Guthrie.

B. Caretaker Guidelines

- Community cat caregivers are permitted to provide food, water, and shelter to community cats.
- 1. Caregivers must make reasonable efforts to:
- a. Have cats sterilized and vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian.
- b. Return cats to their original location unless it is demonstrably unsafe.

• c. Maintain a clean feeding area and minimize nuisance behavior.

C. Veterinary Requirement

All cats participating in TNR must be spayed/neutered, rabies vaccinated, and eartipped.

SECTION 4. PROTECTIONS FOR EAR-TIPPED CATS

A. Return Requirement

Ear-tipped cats shall be returned to their original location after recovery unless:

- Veterinary care is still required,
- The site is demonstrably unsafe, or
- A property owner provides written objection with evidence of ongoing nuisance or threat.

B. Complaint Process

- If a citizen formally objects to the return of an ear-tipped cat:
- 2. 1. Guthrie Animal Welfare or the TNR organization shall evaluate the complaint.
- 3. 2. If the site is deemed unsafe or inappropriate, the cat may be relocated following proper re-acclimation protocols.

SECTION 5. ENFORCEMENT AND LIMITATIONS

- Ear-tipped cats are not considered strays and are exempt from the normal holding period at animal shelters.
- Animal Welfare Officers may not impound or remove ear-tipped cats solely for roaming unless injured or causing harm.
- Community cat caregivers shall not be deemed owners under the city's general animal control ordinances.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY

If any part of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and publication as required by law.
